More emphasis on recovery. There is growing acceptance that offenders should be imprisoned for their rehabilitation, not just their punishment. This entails giving inmates access to programs that can aid in their reintegration into society once they are released, such as education, vocational training, and others.

Increased emphasis on responsibility. Greater responsibility is required for how inmates are treated. This entails making certain that inmates are properly trained and that there are sufficient systems in place to look into and punish abuses.

Increased focus on vulnerable prisoners' needs. The requirements of vulnerable convicts, such as women, children, and those suffering from mental health issues, must receive special consideration. These convicts need to be safeguarded since they are frequently more vulnerable to abuse and neglect.

Increased civic society participation. The subject of prisoners' rights in India has been increasingly well-known thanks in large part to civil society organizations. These groups will remain crucial in pushing for reform and making sure that prisoners' rights are upheld.<sup>15</sup>
